

## AUSTRALIA'S SUPPORT FOR SRI LANKA'S COVID-19 PREPAREDNESS, RESPONSE AND RECOVERY

## AUD 11.7 MILLION (LKR 1,800 MILLION)

AUSTRALIA HAS COMMITTED AUD 11.7 MILLION TO SUPPORT SRI LANKA'S RESPONSE TO COVID-19. Support is focused on three priority areas: <u>health</u> <u>security, stability</u> and <u>economic recovery.</u>

Our support targets women and girls, people with disabilities and those outside of social safety net systems.

## STABILITY



Support for immediate **food security** for households

Continued support for **demining** activities, providing economic livelihood opportunities and contributing to post- conflict stability.

## ECONOMIC RECOVERY

- Australian technical expertise through the Sri Lanka Tourism Alliance is assisting tourism businesses to manage the immediate crisis and effectively plan for business recovery
- Support for the upskilling and multiskilling of tourism sector workers to better equip them for employment opportunities post COVID-19.





- Printed materials for 430,000 children in Grade 1 and 2; and
- Digitalised materials and remote learning support for primary students in Mannar
- Partnering with the private sector to rebuild in an inclusive and resilient manner, supporting organisations to be gender-inclusive in their post-COVID recovery

**HEALTH SECURITY** 

Australia's new **Health Security Initiative** will support the Ministry of Health to implement Sri Lanka's COVID-19 Health Disaster Preparedness and Response Plan, focused on:

- Strengthening national laboratories including provision of equipment training for health officials and support for genomic sequencing;
- Provision of oxygen related supplies;
- Support to health care facilities and staff on case management protocols; and
- Enhancing rapid detection and surveillance of cases including contact tracing, case identification and isolation.



**PPE for frontline workers** to minimise further transmission of COVID-19

Support for improved health measures at points of entry including health safety and screening equipment.



**Sexual and reproductive health** services for women and girls including counselling and hygiene items.

- Support to the Civil Society Collective to address stigma issues and engage communities on COVID-19 preventive measures.
- Support for a national assessment on the impact of COVID-19 on women and girls.
- Provided four PCR machines to Sri Lanka Navy to test for COVID-19 at sea.
- Support for strengthened risk communications focusing on key COVID-19 prevention messages including handwashing and cough etiquette.
